Introduction to the MPA

Our Mission:

To assist, support, and enhance the academic program for the students and teachers at Gaspar de Portola Middle School Highly Gifted Magnet.

Our Members:

All parents of enrolled students in the Highly Gifted Magnet.

Our Governance:

We are governed by a board comprised of 7 members (5 from 7th and 8th grade and 2 from 6th grade). This board is elected annually by the MPA Members.

MPA: How we work

Board Meetings:

Board meetings are held once per month. All meetings take place in the school library.

The Board meets to:

- Discuss <u>fundraising</u> priorities and opportunities, plan and organize fundraising activities including monitoring the donation status.
- Provide <u>support to program wide events</u> and help coordinate field trips, enrichment classes and overnight trips.
- Review and evaluate <u>administration and teacher requests</u> for financial sponsorship of enrichment activities related to the overall academic program according to approved budget and current fundraising progress.
- Review current <u>financial status and corporate compliance.</u>

MPA: How we work (Cont'd)

Parent Meetings:

We rely on Parent Meetings to engage and meet fellow parents. Parent Meetings usually take place in the school library.

- <u>Portola MPA Kickoff Meeting:</u> The Board uses this opportunity to introduce new Board, present budget for the new school year, communicate major events and activities for the year, and welcome new families.
- <u>Portola MPA Year End Meeting:</u> This is the end of the year meeting to elect Board members for the next school year.
- Other General Parent Meeting: The Board tries to invite speakers to discuss topics that are of interests to our Highly Gifted parent community. These meetings are typically aligned with the MPA Board monthly meeting schedule.
- Throughout the school year, we welcome any feedback, requests and suggestions for new opportunities for the students.

Volunteer Opportunities

- Our program relies on the efforts of volunteers to bring enriching opportunities to our students. Without parental involvement and support, many of these activities would simply not take place.

Catalina
Island Marine

(CIMI)

What: A 3 day, 2 night field trip to Guided Discovery's Toyon Bay camp located on Catalina Island. CIMI is a unique program that is hands-on and focuses on experiential science education through activities including: snorkeling, hiking, ecology hikes and marine biology labs.

Who: Portola HGM 6th Graders (Fall of 2018)

When: November 9-11, 2018. Students depart Portola Middle School Friday early in the morning and return mid-afternoon on Sunday.

How Much: Approximately \$300 per person.



Astro Camp

What: A 3 day, 2 night field trip to Guided Discovery's Idyllwild camp located in the San Jacinto Mountains. ASTROCAMP specializes in activities that teach astronomy and the physical sciences while incorporating team building and self esteem through cooperative adventure activities.

Who: Portola HGM 7th Graders (Fall of 2018)

When: November 9-11, 2018. Students depart Portola Middle School Friday early in the morning and return mid-afternoon on Sunday.

How Much: Approximately \$325 per person



W.O.L.F. Camp

What: A 3 day, 2 night field trip to WOLF Camp located in Camp Whittier. WOLF (Wilderness Outdoor Leadership Foundation) Camp is an outdoor education and leadership program that uses a series of challenges requiring ingenuity, innovation and patience to teach team building and leadership.

Who: Portola HGM 8th Graders (Fall of 2018)

When: November 10-12, 2018. Students will depart Portola Middle School Saturday early in the morning and return mid-afternoon on Monday November 12.

How Much: Approximately \$345 per person

Extracurricular and After School Activities/Programs

Various after school activities are offered through the Magnet and the Resident School:

- **GiST (Girls in Science and Tech) Club** Schoolwide. Meetings are held twice a month on Wednesdays and are sponsored by CSUN. Despite the name, boys can-and do-join too!
- MathCounts Club (Mrs. Martin, Magnet only, Wednesdays)
- Writers Lab (Mrs. Miller, Magnet only, Mondays & Thursdays)
- **Debate** (Mr. Stevenson, Magnet only, select Fridays)
- Robotics Club (Mr. Schmidt) Thursdays, schoolwide.
- Battle of the Books Day TBD, schoolwide but the Magnet has their own team.
- Club Fair on Weds. September 12th there will be a Club Fair on the quad during lunch where students can check out all the great clubs we have here at Portola.
 Students can also form their own clubs: go to Portolams.org and click on Clubs for info on how to do this.
- **Plays/Musicals** Schoolwide. Currently auditions have begun for Beauty and the Beast which will have performances in December.





How do we communicate at the Magnet?
